Silver Speaks: 'Form'
An exhibition exploring the skills and processes developed by Contemporary British Silversmiths

Silver Speaks: 'Form' is an exhibition of work by members of Contemporary British Silversmiths. It offers a behind the scenes look at the techniques that enable makers to create work in silver, while exploring their relationship with materials, processes and tools. It is part of *Silver Speaks*, the year long programme of events celebrating the exceptional level of creativity and skill in British silversmithing today. Running from 1st June until 23rd September 2016, it will take place at The Goldsmiths' Centre in London.

The exhibition will provide an insight into the processes behind the making of objects and what is used to create them. Showcasing 33 works alongside the makers' tools, original samples and drawings.

The silversmiths selected were those whose designs successfully interpreted one of the themes outlined in the brief, listed below, as well as simultaneously exhibiting excellence in design and craftsmanship.

- Strike concerning the use of tools to form and manipulate silver to create objects
- Construct relating to building objects using construction techniques such as scoring or folding
- Enrich enhancing an object with decorative finishes such as engraving or etching
- Colour the application of colour to an object through patination, enameling, inlaying or gilding
- Innovate concerning new technologies such as rapid prototyping or the use of traditional techniques employed in new ways

Karin Paynter, Director of Silver Speaks, comments: "Form is all about celebrating the making process, demonstrating the importance of tools and materials for individual silversmiths and showcasing the breadth of craftsmanship in British silversmithing. Through the Silver Speaks programme, Contemporary British Silversmiths is putting silver on the world stage to show how beautiful pieces can be created to enhance contemporary living, architecture and fashion."

Awarding winning multidisciplinary designer Anne Kernan will be working alongside Contemporary British Silversmiths to design the exhibition.

This exhibition complements Silver Speaks' current V&A exhibition 'Idea to Object', which traces how a work in silver is brought into being from the design concept through to the final piece.

Silver Speaks: 'Idea to Object' traces how a work in silver is brought into being from the inspiration, through sketches, models, material experimentation and construction processes, to the final piece. The selected designs in this free display at the V&A encompass a variety of beautiful and intriguing objects – both sculptural and functional – created using a range of different processes, from the traditional to the most cutting edge.

18 of Britain's leading silversmiths, all of whom are members of Contemporary British Silversmiths, were selected by curator and critic Corinne Julius. On display are specially commissioned works at the V&A's Silver Galleries from 8^{th} March $2016 - 2^{nd}$ July 2017. The featured craftspeople include Rauni Higson; Kevin Grey, a car-maker who helped make the Sultan of Brunei's series of unique Bentleys and Juliette Bigley, a health care manager for the NHS – who all went on to train as silversmiths.

This event celebrates the joint 20th anniversaries of Contemporary British Silversmiths and the V&A's Silver Galleries.
